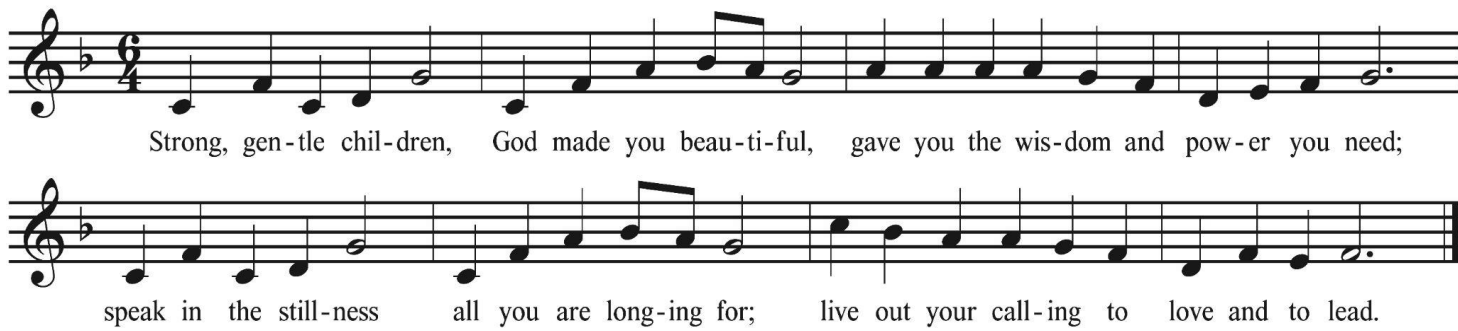

Covenant Leadership Circle

The purpose of this section is to update you on the work of the Covenant Leadership Circle (CLC). We hope that this enables you to have a more thorough understanding of what happens behind the scenes at UPUCC, and to discover opportunities to join us in actualizing new ideas!

Looking Ahead Together: Building Ministry, Community, and Connection

This month's meeting reflected a church community that is actively looking ahead—strengthening ministry, welcoming new people, supporting children and youth, deepening community partnerships, and preparing for the year ahead. Much of the conversation centered on how we can build on what is already working while creating more opportunities for people to connect, participate, and help shape our shared ministry.

Financial and Administrative Updates

The group approved the previous month's minutes. A July financial update is still being finalized because of the early meeting date, and a summary will be shared once the reports are complete. The year-to-date financial picture and full financial report are available in the church's financial materials. An audit report was also discussed. The review highlighted the unique nature of our online community and was encouraging in that it did not identify major gaps in the church's operations. Follow-up materials from the audit conversation will be shared by email. There was also discussion about whether the audit can be shared with covenant partners.

Welcoming New Visitors

A significant part of the conversation focused on ways to make a first visit to our church more welcoming and memorable. The group explored creating small gift bags for new visitors that could include a postcard or brochure, branded pens, tissues, a snack or candy, a magnet, a small bottle of water, and other helpful items. There was also interest in including information about our social justice ministries and even notes from children, similar to the welcome materials shared at Out! Raleigh.

Preparing for Our Next Chapter of Ministry

The church is also preparing to develop its 2027 Ministry Plan. Home Group gatherings are taking place throughout August, with many being led by church members. The conversations and ideas shared through these groups will help shape the ministry plan, with a goal of completing the core plan before September 20. A broader church survey will also be distributed soon. Together, the Home Groups and survey will give the congregation meaningful opportunities to share hopes, ideas, and priorities for the future. Task force work is expected to move forward after August, with a visible presence planned for Kickoff Sunday on September 13.

Guns to Gardens: A Ministry With Momentum

The recent Guns to Gardens event was celebrated as an example of what can happen when thoughtful ministry planning, community partnerships, and financial support come together. The event grew beyond its initial expectations, attracted additional financial participation, and concluded with a surplus. The organizers also gathered survey responses that can help tell the story of the event and its impact. The group discussed ways to share those results more broadly—not only within religious communities, but throughout the wider community. Possibilities include updating the church website, making greater use of social media to tell ministry stories rather than simply announce events, and building on coverage already received through the UCC Southern Conference newsletter. There was also discussion of pursuing broader media coverage. Because the event was made possible in part through support from RAW Tools South, a motion was approved to give more than \$800 of the cash surplus to RAW Tools South as an expression of gratitude for their partnership and discounted 2025 rate. Gift cards from the surplus will be held for next year's event. Looking ahead, the hope is for Guns to Gardens to become an annual event, with different partner faith communities taking the lead from year to year. Our church may also offer its facility as a location, since the space and traffic flow worked particularly well. Perhaps most importantly, the conversation emphasized that the impact of Guns to Gardens cannot be measured only in attendance numbers or dollars. The stories, relationships, outreach, and social justice work generated through the event are an important part of its success.

PACE and Community Engagement

PACE is beginning to look toward the coming election season, with particular attention to education, voter registration, and early voting. There is also ongoing work with Healing Transitions. The group discussed how the church can amplify the work already being done by community organizations and make useful, reliable information accessible to people.

Building on the Energy of Out! Raleigh

The church's presence at Out! Raleigh was another encouraging example of community engagement. The booth generated good conversations, attracted interest through merchandise and signage, and resulted in new email connections. Most of those who shared their email addresses remain subscribed to the church's Friday email. The next challenge is helping people take a natural next step—from meeting us at a community event to exploring the church more fully. Online worship can be an especially welcoming entry point for those who are curious but not yet ready to attend in person. The team also discussed reusing the popular photo booth and signs at future church events, including the August fellowship cookout. There was strong interest in creating magnets or other materials based on the signs for future welcome bags. The group also hopes to build a stronger connection between major community events and upcoming church initiatives, and to plan an event soon after next year's Out! Raleigh to maintain that momentum.

Making Giving Easier

The possibility of accepting donations through services such as Venmo or PayPal was discussed. Having a simple way for people to give electronically could make it easier to receive donations at community events and during worship.

Supporting the Creativity Group

The Creativity Group is working to improve how its materials, cards, and donations are stored and displayed. Because some donated materials have gone missing or been damaged, the group is seeking a dedicated and secure space where its items can be stored and displayed safely. A tall rolling rack has been purchased as one possible solution. There was discussion about using lobby space rather than the worship area during the week, as well as creating a digital payment option.

Coordinating Building Use

The group discussed ways to make information about upcoming building rentals more accessible, including potentially adding rental information to the bulletin. Since the Friday email has limited space, other communication options may be needed. It is also important to clearly communicate that renters are not permitted to enter the church office area.

What's Coming Up

There are several opportunities for connection and participation in the coming weeks:

- **August:** Home Group networking and conversations shaping the 2027 Ministry Plan
- **August 30:** Fellowship cookout
- **September 13:** Kickoff Sunday, with task forces invited to have a presence
- **September:** Development of the draft 2027 Ministry Plan
- **September 20:** Next meeting and continued work on the ministry plan

There is also continuing work around racial equity training for our church and the wider community.

An Invitation to Be Part of What's Next

Across all of these conversations, one theme was clear: the future of our church is something we build together. Whether through a Home Group, a task force, a community event, welcoming a visitor, sharing an idea through the upcoming survey, or simply showing up and getting to know someone new, there are many ways to participate. The energy around Guns to Gardens, Out! Raleigh, Home Groups, and our upcoming ministry planning reminds us that ministry grows when people bring their gifts, ideas, time, and care. If you have been wondering where you might plug in, this is a great season to take that next step. There is a place for you in what we are building together.
